Base Location: Sugar Hill, NH Best Dates: June 7–15 (adjust slightly for current bloom reports)

Day 1: Arrival + Afternoon Lupines + Local Eats Morning Departure: Drive up via I-93 N to Exit 38 (Franconia). Noon – Lunch at Polly's Pancake Parlor (Sugar Hill)

## Polly's Pancake Parlor

Try: Buckwheat pancakes with maple cream and bacon. This iconic spot often has lupines blooming right around the property. 1:30 PM – Sugar Hill Lupine Loop (Self-Guided Driving Tour) Use this interactive map or paper maps from local inns or the <u>Franconia Notch Chamber</u>. Sunset Hill Road – sweeping fields with lupines and White Mountain views St. Matthew's Chapel – a white chapel nestled in purple blooms Sugar Hill Sampler – gift shop with adjoining lupine fields 3:30 PM – Ice Cream + Scenic View

Harman's Cheese & Country Store (open seasonally)

Grab a snack and enjoy the small lupine garden near the store.

4:30 PM – Check-in to Lodging

Stonybrook Motel & Lodge (Franconia) – budget-friendly with a pool and views

Seasonal menus using local produce and NH-raised meats

Optional Evening: Sunset walk at Echo Lake Beach (Franconia Notch State Park) – nice golden hour views. (\$ not generally free)

Day 2: Mountains, Covered Bridge, Waterfalls & More Lupines
7:30 AM – Breakfast at your inn or at Iron Furnace Brewing (light breakfast + coffee on weekends)
9:00 AM – Franconia Notch State Park Nature Loop

The Basin (off I-93) – short walk to waterfalls and pools

Flume Gorge (Also on I-93) (if time allows, \$18+ admission, 2-mile loop)

Spot occasional roadside lupines as you drive between trailheads 11:30 AM – Lunch Picnic at Frost Place or Viewing Field Pick up sandwiches from Raven's Nest Coffee House in Franconia Picnic near lupines at the former home of poet Robert Frost, now a museum (optional admission, or just view the grounds) 1:00 PM – Explore Littleton Shop and walk the Riverwalk, visit Chutters (the longest candy counter) Lupines may appear at field edges around the outskirts of town 2:30 PM – Return Drive with Scenic Stops Optional scenic detours if heading back to I-93 south: Lupines along Route 117 or Route 116 Historic covered bridge on Route 18 (around Bethlehem) Drive through Whitefield for additional late-season lupines

## 📋 What to Bring

Camera or use your phone (helps to have a zoom lens) Sunscreen and bug spray (gnats, mosquitoes, and ticks) Water and snacks for roadside stops Binoculars (lupine fields are also great birding spots!) Lightweight raincoat – June weather is changeable
